Installation of underground concrete reinforcements for new bridge











Dear stakeholder,

Significant progress is being made at the project site, with earthworks operations and groundwork for the new slip roads currently underway. Underground works and installation of reinforced concrete for the new bridge have been successfully completed, and preparations for the above ground structure are now in progress on both sides of the A249.

Works Update and Upcoming Works

Structure

Throughout March, the focus of activities was primarily around the construction of below-ground concrete structures for the new bridge on both sides of the A249. These construction works have now been successfully completed.

In April, the construction of above-ground structures will begin, with the completion of the first wall anticipated by the end of the month. Additionally, 45-meter-long structural beams designed to support the new bridge, will be manufactured off-site and prepared for painting.

Highways

Alongside the structures team, the highways section is progressing as work continues. The following activities are currently ongoing and will continue into April:

- Earthworks operations and relocation of excess soil
- Kerbing activities
- Surveys of the existing drainage network and drainage installation across site
- Digging of trial holes to locate and divert existing utility services
- Monitoring traffic management
- Removal of vehicle protective metal barriers on both sides of the A249
- Construction of new road sections

Traffic Management Update

Traffic management plans are being monitored to ensure disruption is minimised as much as possible while working within safety standards. Future road closures will be directly communicated to stakeholders.
